

Derek Carruthers (Professor Emeritus, Nottingham Trent University) has been a practising artist for over 60 years. A student at Newcastle in the 1950s he was a pupil of Victor Pasmore on the radical Basic Design course rooted in Bauhaus principles. This celebration of Carruthers' work includes early Constructivist mobiles alongside lay figure paintings that have preoccupied him since the late 1980s.



Festival Memorial 'Organ Mass'


Wednesday 11th September, 9.00am

As part of the regular midweek Mass at this church, Alan Wilson will adorn it with colourful organ improvisations on the fine Conacher instrument, following the great French liturgical tradition, as practiced in Notre Dame, Paris. This Mass will be in honour of the great cathedral, so very nearly completely destroyed by fire earlier this year. The organ music will have a Laurentian connection too, as it was in Paris that Lawrence, ridden with tuberculosis, spent his last few dying days, before finally passing away in Venice. To the theme 'Death and Resurrection', the organ portrays Notre Dame rising again from the ashes, and Lawrence's 'living' spirit now abounds in Eastwood.
