
Wednesday 11th September, 9.00am

As part of the regular midweek Mass at this church, Alan Wilson will adorn it with colourful organ improvisations on the fine Conacher instrument, following the great French liturgical tradition, as practiced in Notre Dame, Paris. This Mass will be in honour of the great cathedral, so very nearly completely destroyed by fire earlier this year. The organ music will have a Laurentian connection too, as it was in Paris that Lawrence, ridden with tuberculosis, spent his last few dying days, before finally passing away in Vence. To the theme 'Death and Resurrection', the organ portrays Notre Dame rising again from the ashes, and Lawrence's 'living' spirit now abounds in Eastwood.
