

#### SEMINAR - D. H. LAWRENCE: PORTRAITS, ENVIRONMENT AND WELLBEING

Sunday 4th September 2-5pm (From 12pm to see the painting)

A half day seminar, led by Doctor Andrew Harrison (the University of Nottingham) and Professor Terry Gifford (Bath Spa University). To celebrate the acquisition of the last known portrait of D. H. Lawrence by Joep Nicolas (1929), Andrew and Terry will discuss some of the more striking portraits of Lawrence completed during his lifetime in order to set in context the recently-acquired painting. Louise Dunning, Curator of Fine and Decorative Art at Nottingham City Museums, will also speak about the provenance and acquisition of this important portrait. The event includes afternoon tea after the seminar, free parking and entry to the Abbey to view the painting of Lawrence.
